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


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

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HONG KONG LAUNCHES FIRST AUTOMATIC HYDROGEN CHARGING SYSTEM FOR EV: A STEP TOWARDS A GREENER FUTURE

Hong Kong is taking a significant leap towards a greener future with the launch of its first public automatic hydrogen charging system for electric vehicles (EVs). Set to commence operations in the second quarter of 2026, this innovative project is located at the city's Science Park and aims to be a groundbreaking hub for hydrogen-based EV charging.

Pioneered by the Hong Kong and China Gas Co Ltd (Towngas) and the Hong Kong Science and Technology Parks Corp, the system will harness hydrogen from the city's gas network to generate clean electricity for charging, emitting only water vapor as a byproduct.

As the demand for electric vehicles soars—over 110,000 EVs registered in just five years—this initiative is timely and essential. With around 70% of newly registered cars being electric, the pressure on existing charging infrastructure is mounting. The automatic system promises to offer up to five 7-kilowatt



charging points daily, complete with energy storage for reliable performance.

Chief Executive Officer of HKSTP, Albert Wong, emphasizes that this project is not just a technical advancement but also a catalyst for the broader adoption of clean energy in transportation. The government is backing more hydrogen initiatives, aiming to position Hong Kong as a regional leader in hydrogen technology.

As the city explores these innovative solutions, it moves closer to achieving its ambitious climate goals while promoting a sustainable, low-carbon urban environment.



NINH BINH PLANS MAJOR INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT TO BOOST TOURISM

In an ambitious bid to bolster its tourist appeal, Ninh Binh Province in northern Vietnam has announced plans for a major international airport covering an impressive 720 hectares. This facility, projected to accommodate up to 10 million passengers annually, aims to tap into the region's thriving tourism sector.

The proposed airport will be strategically situated in Liem Tuyen Ward, conveniently located about 80 kilometers from Hanoi's Noi Bai International Airport and 85 kilometers from both Hai Phong and Thanh Hoa airports. This positioning not only enhances accessibility but also improves the overall travel experience for visitors seeking to explore the natural and cultural wonders of Ninh Binh.

As a 4E-category airport, the new facility will be equipped to handle wide-body aircraft, including the Boeing 787 and Airbus

models. Authorities highlight that this project is not just an airport; it's a pivotal investment in the region's economic growth and tourism infrastructure. By alleviating congestion at existing airports, the new facility is set to enhance travel efficiency and stimulate local development.

Ninh Binh's local government has already submitted a proposal to include the airport in Vietnam's national development plan for 2021-2030, with a long-term roadmap set to extend to 2050. This long-sighted approach underscores the province's commitment to fostering tourism and providing better connectivity for travelers.

With vibrant tourist destinations such as the UNESCO World Heritage site of Trang An and the ancient capital of Hoa Lu, Ninh Binh is already a treasure trove of cultural and natural experiences. As the province prepares for this transformative project, it anticipates welcoming even more visitors—especially after reporting over 7 million arrivals in just the first half of 2025. The construction of this international airport promises to be a game changer, elevating Ninh Binh's status on the global tourism map.



VINCI Airports Corporation Expands Commitment to Sustainable Development in Cambodia

A LEADING JAPANESE COMPANY EYES THE INVESTMENT IN CAMBODIA'S WATER INFRASTRUCTURE

In a significant development for Cambodia's water infrastructure, Marubeni Corporation, a leading Japanese multinational, has expressed strong interest in investing in the sector. The announcement follows a meeting between HE Hem Vandy, Minister of Industry, Science, Technology, and Innovation, and a delegation from Marubeni on 1 July 2025.

Marubeni representatives highlighted the company's extensive experience in the water supply industry, noting their operations serve over 10 million people in Manila, 2 million in Chile, and an additional million in various regions across the globe. Their proposal aims to implement a similar business model in Cambodia's urban centers while also expanding services to rural areas, thus contributing to the country's efforts towards achieving Sustainable Development Goals, specifically Goal 6.1.

Minister Hem Vandy welcomed the initiative, emphasizing the Royal Government's commitment to fostering private investment that focuses on sustainable, long-term solutions rather than short-term fixes. He urged potential investors to develop comprehensive plans that consider the increasing demand for water as well as future industrial development



needs, particularly in processing and distribution networks.

Marubeni Corporation is recognized as one of Japan's largest and most diversified investment firms, with ventures spanning machinery, energy, chemicals, food, textiles, metals, and minerals. Their collaboration with both governmental and private sectors on large-scale infrastructure projects positions them uniquely to address issues related to water scarcity and quality in Cambodia.

This investment could mark a transformative step forward in enhancing the country's water infrastructure, ensuring access to clean and reliable water for all Cambodians as they strive towards sustainable development.

CHINESE INVESTOR ANNOUNCES MAJOR INVESTMENT IN SOLAR POWER PLANT IN KAMPONG SPEU PROVINCE



Kampong Speu - In a groundbreaking development for Cambodia's renewable energy sector, Dongbaishan Holding Group Co., Ltd., a leading Chinese firm, has unveiled plans to invest approximately USD 500 million in the creation of the province's first solar power plant. The announcement was made during a meeting on 7 July 2025, between His Excellency Dr. Cheam Chansophorn, Governor of Kampong Speu Province, and Mr. Si Juchen, Chairman of Dongbaishan Holding Group.

Mr. Si emphasized the company's extensive experience in the renewable energy sector over the past two decades in China and expressed optimism about the investment landscape in Cambodia. He also noted plans to partner with the Cambodia-China Community Development Association and SL Sunlight Green Energy Sorlapower Co. Ltd. to establish a solar facility that will span nearly 600 hectares of land in Kampong Speu.

Construction of the solar power plant is slated to begin in mid-July 2025 and is expected to generate between 1,500 to 3,000 jobs for residents once operational. In response to the proposed project, Governor Dr. Cheam Chansophorn pledged the province's full support and committed to facilitating the necessary legal and procedural processes to ensure a smooth establishment of the plant.

Kampong Speu Province is home to around 2,442 factories and enterprises, with over 90% of investments coming from Chinese entities. This trend highlights the strong bilateral relations between Cambodia and China and the increasing interest in Cambodia's renewable energy sector.

This initiative marks a significant step toward sustainable development and economic growth in the region, aligning with Cambodia's vision for a greener future. The investment not only reflects confidence in the country's potential but also represents a crucial move towards meeting its energy needs sustainably.



Cambodia and World Bank Strengthen Commitment to Long- Term Cooperation

USA AND CAMBODIA STRENGTHEN TIES FOR A PROSPEROUS FUTURE

In a significant reaffirmation of their ongoing partnership, the United States has committed to deepening cooperation with Cambodia, aiming to foster a prosperous future for both nations. This commitment comes as the two countries prepare to celebrate the 249th anniversary of the United States' Independence Day on 4 July and the 75th anniversary of Cambodia-US diplomatic relations on 3 July 2025.

During a recent event at the US Embassy in Phnom Penh, Ms. Bridgette L. Walker, the Chargé d'Affaires, emphasized the importance of the 75th anniversary as a symbol of the strong friendship between the two countries. She reiterated the mutual pledge to enhance collaboration that promotes prosperity, peace, and progress.

H.E. Sun Chanthol, Deputy Prime Minister and First Vice Chairman of the Council for the Development of Cambodia, echoed these sentiments, stating that Cambodia's relationship with the United States is built on mutual respect and effective cooperation. He noted that this partnership has expanded significantly, covering areas like trade, investment, defense cooperation, education, cultural preservation, and people-to-people connections.



Highlighting Cambodia's status as a reliable partner, His Excellency expressed optimism about the continued growth of friendly relations, which he deemed strategically vital for both nations.

Recent trade statistics reveal a positive trend: in the first five months of 2025, trade volume between Cambodia and its international partners exceeded USD 25 billion, a remarkable 18.5% increase compared to the same period in 2024. Notably, trade with the United States reached USD 4.4 million, reflecting a 27% surge.

Additionally, Cambodia has become a favored destination for American tourists, with the country leading in ticket sales to the iconic Angkor site in early 2025.

As both nations look to the future, their strengthened partnership promises new opportunities for collaboration and growth, reinforcing their commitment to building a prosperous future together.

SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS IN THE BANTEAY MEANCHEY IRRIGATION PROJECT



The Irrigation Development Project for Flood Mitigation and Prevention (IDFMP) in Banteay Meanchey province is making remarkable strides, with progress reported at approximately 81.60%. His Excellency Pon Sacha, Secretary of State at the Ministry of Water Resources and Meteorology, led a meeting today to review the project's advancements and address existing challenges.

During the meeting, H.E. Pon Sacha noted that the project has exceeded its initial target of 76.81%. However, he acknowledged the rainy season, which has brought almost daily rainfall, as a significant factor hindering construction timelines. To tackle this issue, it was decided to implement solar energy systems, aiming to replace traditional electricity grids and generators for the operation of the water gates.

The Secretary of State urged the construction company to

expedite their efforts, stressing the importance of completing key phases before potential cross-border floods could impact the project's major construction sites.

The IDFMP, which harnesses water from streams and rivers along the Cambodia-Thailand border, has successfully established critical infrastructure. This includes five large-scale irrigation and drainage canals stretching a total of 87.6 kilometers, the construction of 216 drainage structures, and the rehabilitation of three significant reservoirs: Pongr, Wang Hang, and Kanseng, along with repairs to the O Khai Dan Reservoir.

Once completed, the project is expected to provide irrigation for approximately 28,354 hectares of farmland during the rainy season and around 13,827 hectares in the dry season. This initiative is set to benefit over 42,213 farming families across 12 communes, including those in Poipet City, Malai District, O Chrov District, and Serey Sophon City.

The ongoing efforts in Banteay Meanchey highlight the government's commitment to enhancing agricultural productivity and flood resilience in the region, ensuring a brighter future for local farmers and communities.



Cambodia and Korea Collaborate to Enhance Trade and Investment Cooperation

In a significant move to bolster bilateral ties, Cambodia and Korea have engaged in a series of discussions aimed at identifying effective strategies to overcome challenges in trade and investment cooperation. The 2nd Cambodia-Korea Public-Private Dialogue took place on 25 June 2025, led by H.E. Sun Chanthol, Deputy Prime Minister and First Vice President of the Council for the Development of Cambodia, alongside H.E. Park Jung Wook, the Korean Ambassador to Cambodia.

The event brought together key stakeholders, including representatives from the Korea Trade and Investment Promotion Agency (KOTRA), the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA), and the Korean Chamber of Commerce in Cambodia (KOCHAM), as well as various members of the private sector.

During the discussions, Korean investors in Cambodia highlighted existing challenges to their ventures, creating a platform for dialogue aimed at fostering solutions. This initiative aims to enhance economic ties, build trust within the South Korean business community, and attract an increased investment flow into Cambodia.

Ambassador Park expressed optimism about the outcome of the dialogue, emphasizing the importance of collaborative efforts in addressing investor concerns. He reiterated the joint commitment to improving Cambodia's investment climate and expanding the footprint of Korean enterprises within the country. "Through forums like this, we can reinforce our bilateral cooperation," he stated.

The dialogue coincided with the "Korea Brand and Entertainment Expo 2025," held in Cambodia on 20-21 June which attracted 5,360 visitors, including 55 Korean companies and 138 buyers. Officials hailed this event as the largest Korean trade show in Cambodia to date, showcasing the untapped potential of the Cambodian market.

Both countries are optimistic that continued dialogue and collaborative efforts will lead to a prosperous future for trade and investment relations, paving the way for mutual growth and enhanced economic partnerships.

PHNOM PENH AUTONOMOUS PORT SEES SIGNIFICANT REVENUE GROWTH IN EARLY 2025

The Phnom Penh Autonomous Port has reported a remarkable financial performance in the first five months of 2025, with revenue exceeding USD 17.5 million, marking a notable increase of 22% compared to the same period last year. According to an unaudited press release issued by the port authority, the total revenue for this period reached USD 17,526,054.

The port's success is driven by robust operations, with revenue from port operations alone amounting to USD 14,363,367, a 23% increase from 2024. Revenue generated by the port authority also rose 23%, totaling USD 2,588,335. However, it was noted that revenue from other services dipped 10%, indicating some challenges in that segment.

May 2025 proved particularly fruitful, as the Phnom Penh Autonomous Port achieved revenue of USD 3,897,861 for the month, reflecting a remarkable 24% growth year-on-year.



In terms of cargo handling, the port received 2,174,864 tons of cargo and fuel during the first five months, representing a 21.33% increase over the same timeframe in 2024. The number of containers transported also saw a significant rise, with approximately 206,055 TEUs processed, marking an increase of 28.75%.

The ongoing growth of the Phnom Penh Autonomous Port underscores its vital role in the region's trade and logistics, positioning it as a key player in Cambodia's economic development.

MAJOR PROGRESS IN PREK O'DAMREY KRES-PREK THMEY IRRIGATION EXPANSION PROJECT

4. Construction of red gravel roads bordering both sides of the Prek O'Damrey Kres, the main canal, and Prek Thmey.

5. Repair and construction of 10 bridges spanning Prek O'Damrey Kres and Prek Thmey.

6. Upgrades to art structures that connect the main canal of Prek Thmey to 50 irrigation canals.

7. Establishment of community buildings dedicated to the management and maintenance of the irrigation system.

Looking ahead, the project is set to significantly enhance irrigation capacity and flood protection. The implementation of additional enhancements will commence in June 2024, with an expected completion date of June 2025. Upon completion, the initiative holds the promise of increasing irrigation capabilities over approximately 16,200 hectares, benefitting around 3,727 families in the region.

This project not only aims to bolster agricultural productivity but also contributes to the overall sustainable development of the local community.

The ambitious project to expand the Prek O'Damrey Kres-Prek Thmey irrigation system has reached an impressive milestone, achieving approximately 95% of its targeted capacity. This significant progress was confirmed during a recent inspection by His Excellency Chan Yuttha, Secretary of State of the Ministry of Water Resources and Meteorology.

Key developments in the project include:

1. Restoration of the 8,287-kilometer-long natural Prek O'Damrey Kres.
2. Rehabilitation of the 12,600-kilometer-long natural Prek Thmey.
3. Renovation of the 4,876-kilometer-long main canal.

Cambodia Sees Significant Surge in Construction Material Imports in Early 2025

In a remarkable indication of the ongoing expansion in its construction and real estate sectors, Cambodia imported over USD 1 billion worth of construction materials during the first five months of 2025. This figure reached USD 1.017 billion, marking a substantial 35% increase from USD 752 million in the corresponding period of 2024, according to the latest report from the General Department of Customs and Excise of Cambodia.

Key insights from the report highlight that iron and steel comprised a significant portion of these imports, totaling approximately USD 477 million, a notable rise of 53% compared to last year. Despite this overall growth, imports of cement saw a slight decline, with nearly USD 8 million imported, reflecting a marginal drop of 0.23% from the previous year.

These developments underline the persistent dynamism within Cambodia's construction industry, which continues to be a pivotal contributor to the nation's economic growth. Analysts suggest that the robust performance in construction materials imports is indicative of ongoing investment and development in infrastructure and real estate, reinforcing the sector's role as a cornerstone of Cambodia's economic landscape.

As the country moves forward, the government and stakeholders in the construction industry remain optimistic about sustained growth and further opportunities in the sector.

NEW RURAL ROADS CONSTRUCTION COMMENCES IN CAMBODIA TO BOOST ECO-TOURISM

The Cambodian government has officially broken ground on three new rural roads in Teuk Phos district, Kampong Chhnang province. This initiative marks a significant step in enhancing the country's rural infrastructure and supporting eco-tourism, with a total length of 41.10 kilometers planned for the new roads.

The groundbreaking ceremony was attended by His Excellency Chhay Rithsen, Minister of Rural Development, and H.E. Huot Hak, Minister of Tourism. The project is part of the Cambodia Sustainable Landscape and Ecotourism Project (CSLEP), which aims to connect key tourist destinations, including the Thma Khre Waterfall, Sre Ampil Waterfall, and Svay Canyon.

Currently, Cambodia boasts over 50,000 kilometers of rural roads, with 8,527 kilometers already constructed as climate-resilient asphalt and concrete roads, representing nearly 20% of the total rural road network. The newly proposed roads will feature double-deck asphalt and concrete designs, enhancing their durability and accessibility throughout the year.



In an exciting development, the project is set to benefit approximately 6,882 families, totaling 28,598 residents, across 12 villages and 4 communes in the region. These improvements are expected to significantly increase tourist visits to the eco-tourism communities, fostering local economic growth.

H.E. Dr. Suos Kong, Secretary of State of the Ministry of Rural Development, highlighted that the CSLEP project will unfold over eight years, from 2019 to 2027. The initiative is funded through a collaboration of the Royal Government of Cambodia, the Global Environment Facility, and the World Bank.

This project not only aims to improve accessibility to vital eco-tourism sites but also to promote sustainable economic benefits for rural communities in Cambodia.



GOVERNMENT LAUNCHES MAJOR ROAD DEVELOPMENT PROJECT IN KAMPONG THOM PROVINCE

The Government of Cambodia has announced a substantial budget allocation of over 43,377 million riels, equivalent to more than USD 10.58 million, for the implementation of 117 development projects in Battambang province. This announcement was made by Mr. Han Sihip, the Director of Investment Planning for the Battambang Provincial Administration, during a recent talk show on Radio Cambodia's National Radio, Chamkar Chek, on 23 June 2025.

The allocated funds will support various infrastructure initiatives aimed at enhancing the quality of life for residents. This year's projects include 37 concrete road developments, 7 stone paving initiatives, 49 projects focused on red and natural gravel roads, 6 dirt road constructions, 6 canal restoration efforts, 5 drainage systems, 1 pond excava-

tion, 2 community pier constructions, 3 school buildings, and 1 solar power installation.

Out of the 91 projects that were up for bidding, 15 have been fully completed, 7 are over 50% complete, 9 have made less than 50% progress, and 21 projects have been contracted and are scheduled to begin implementation soon.

Mr. Sihip emphasized the importance of concrete roads as a priority in the province, citing their durability and necessity for urban residents. Additionally, he noted the significance of red paved roads and natural gravel roads in certain communes, as some distances between villages and districts in Battambang make concrete road construction infeasible. These roadways are essential for facilitating transportation for both residents and the agricultural products they deliver to market.

The development projects are expected to not only improve infrastructure but also enhance economic opportunities for the communities in Battambang, linking people and resources more efficiently.

Cambodia Sees Surge in Investment Projects: 51 New Initiatives Announced in August 2025



Cambodia officially welcomed 51 new investment projects in August 2025, with a total investment capital soaring to an impressive USD 608 million, as reported by the Council for the Development of Cambodia (CDC). This impressive influx of investment is expected to create approximately 27,000 jobs, providing a significant boost to the local economy.

Of the projects registered last month, 35 are set to be established outside the special economic zones, while 16 will be developed within these designated areas, highlighting a balanced approach to investment distribution across the country.

According to the CDC, the investment landscape in August was marked by a diverse range of sources. Domestic investors led the charge, contributing nearly 46% of the total capital, followed closely by China at nearly 44%. Additional contributions came from

Singapore (over 6%), England (nearly 3%), the Cayman Islands (around 2%), the British Virgin Islands (nearly 1%), and Japan (nearly 1%).

The uptick in investment is part of a broader trend observed in the first eight months of 2025, during which the CDC approved a total of 491 investment projects, amounting to an estimated USD 7.2 billion. This reflects a significant increase of 204 projects—71% more than the same period in 2024—along with a remarkable boost in investment capital of approximately USD 2.5 billion, or 50%.

Comparatively, the number of investment projects registered throughout the entirety of 2024 stood at just 414, indicating that Cambodia is poised for substantial growth and development within the year ahead.

CAMBODIA AND CHINA JOIN FORCES TO ENHANCE VOCATIONAL TRAINING STANDARDS

In a significant move to elevate vocational training standards, Cambodia and China have announced the joint establishment of a Vocational Development and Skills Enhancement Center. The initiative was formalized through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed between the Ministry of Labor and Vocational Training of Cambodia and the Education Development Foundation of Anhui Province, China.

The MoU was signed in a ceremony chaired by His Excellency Heng Sour, Cambodia's Minister of Labor, and Ms. Ling Shuangying, Secretary-General of the International Vocational Education and Training Development Alliance from Anhui Province.

Minister Heng Sour emphasized the importance of this collaboration, noting that it will serve as a catalyst for attracting foreign investments, particularly from China, to the Kingdom. "This partnership is a vital step towards enhancing our vocational training capabilities, making Cambodia a competitive destination for international investors," he stated.

Ms. Ling Shuangying echoed these sentiments, highlighting the memorandum as a cornerstone in advancing cooperation in vocational training, spe-



cifically in high-demand sectors such as e-commerce, electric vehicle technology, and computer technology. "Together, we aim to elevate professional standards recognized by both nations," she affirmed.

The MoU aims to create a joint training and skills recognition center that will focus on the development of collaborative curricula, vocational training programs, and academic exchanges, ultimately striving to meet international standards in technical and vocational education. This partnership not only signifies a commitment to enhancing skills development but also fosters deeper ties between Cambodia and China in the education sector.

As both nations move forward with this collaborative effort, it is expected that the Vocational Development and Skills Enhancement Center will play a pivotal role in preparing a skilled workforce ready to meet the challenges of the global economy.



CAMBODIA AND JAPAN UNITE TO BOOST INVESTMENT IN ECO-FRIENDLY CASSAVA PLASTIC PRODUCTION

In a significant move towards sustainable development, Cambodia and Japan have pledged to enhance collaboration in the environmental sector, specifically focusing on attracting Japanese investors for the production of bioplastics from cassava in Cambodia. This commitment emerged from a recent meeting between His Excellency Dr. Eang Sophallet, Cambodia's Minister of Environment, and His Excellency ASAO Keiichiro, Japan's Minister of Environment, held during the 18th ASEAN Environment Ministers' Meeting in Malaysia on 3 September 2025.

The two ministers underscored the importance of this partnership, which follows a history of successful

cooperation between their countries. Minister ASAO Keiichiro highlighted the successful collaboration on the 22nd Workshop on Greenhouse Gas Inventories (GHG) in Asia, which was hosted in Phnom Penh from 15 -18 July 2025.

As part of their collaboration, Cambodia and Japan signed a letter of cooperation aimed at strengthening the greenhouse gas inventory system, a crucial step within the framework of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

Minister Eang Sophallet noted the broader scope of their partnership, envisioning the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) that will encompass various areas, including science and technology for environmental protection. The discussions also touched on key initiatives such as enhancing joint carbon crediting mechanisms, promoting electric vehicles, reducing plastic waste in oceans, and seeking investment partners for the innovative production of biodegradable plastics derived from cassava.

This initiative not only aims to bolster Cambodia's green economy but also positions both nations at the forefront of sustainable practices that address global environmental challenges.



World Bank Invests in Cambodia's Future with Multi-Million Dollar Education Initiative

The World Bank (WB) has made a significant commitment to enhancing early childhood education in Cambodia with the announcement of a generous grant aimed at building public childcare centers and preschools across the country. This ambitious project, backed by a USD 100 million investment, will see the establishment of 60 public childcare facilities and 60 new preschools, directly benefiting the nation's youngest learners.

On 1 September 2025, the World Bank detailed its plan, which includes USD 100 million co-financing from the International Development Association (IDA) and a USD 5 million grant from the Early Learning Partnership Multi-Donor Trust Fund. This initiative is designed to bolster literacy and numeracy skills among children, ensuring a stronger foundation as they transition into primary education.

Over 1.7 million Cambodian children are expected to benefit from this project, which aims to transform the educational landscape of the country. Tania Meyer, the World Bank Country Manager for Cambodia, expressed optimism about the initiative's potential to

equip children with essential skills necessary for their academic and career futures.

In addition to enhancing primary education, the project recognizes the critical need for affordable and safe childcare as it seeks to empower working mothers. With more than 50,000 children aged 3 to 5 and an estimated 2,200 children aged 0 to 2 anticipated to benefit from the new facilities, the initiative aims to create a nurturing environment that prepares children for school and beyond.

"This project is a vital step toward building a stronger and more resilient education system in Cambodia," Meyer stated. "By investing in early childhood education, we are investing in the future of our children, who will become the leaders and innovators of tomorrow."

As Cambodia embarks on this transformative journey, the World Bank stands proud to support initiatives that foster growth, resilience, and opportunity for the nation's young citizens, ensuring they are well-prepared for the demands of future job markets.

GOVERNMENT UNVEILS PLANS FOR NEW AIRPORT IN RATANAKIRI PROVINCE

In a significant development for Cambodia's aviation sector, the Royal Government has announced the designation of nearly 2,000 hectares of land in the Lumphat district of Ratanakiri province for the construction of a new airport. This initiative will be carried out through a public-private partnership, as outlined in a letter from the Council of Ministers dated 2 September 2025.

The Council of Ministers has confirmed that a 1,905-hectare area located in Thmey village, within the Chey Odom commune, has been earmarked for this ambitious project. Plans for the new airport also include the development of supporting public infrastructure. However, the project will proceed only after comprehensive studies are conducted to assess its social and environmental impacts.

Following the completion of the environmental impact assessments, an inter-ministerial



working group is expected to present its findings to Prime Minister Samdech Hun Manet. This report will provide recommendations for the next steps in advancing the airport project in Ratanakiri province.

This airport development is poised to enhance connectivity and bolster economic growth in the region, marking a pivotal move in Cambodia's ongoing investments in transportation infrastructure.



CAMBODIA LAUNCHES AMBITIOUS \$95 MILLION RURAL WATER AND SANITATION INITIATIVE

USD 3 million, comes from the Japan Fund for Prosperity and Resilience in Asia and the Pacific (JFPR).

Spanning a five-year timeline from 2024 to 2029, the initiative targets nine provinces—Battambang, Pailin, Banteay Meanchey, Oddar Meanchey, Preah Vihear, Stung Treng, Kratie, Kampong Speu, and Kampot—covering approximately 400 villages and 50 communes.

At the ceremony, HE Chhay Rithsen, Minister of Rural Development, highlighted the ministry's ongoing efforts to implement the National Action Plan on Rural Water Supply, Sanitation, and Hygiene. He expressed optimism about the project's potential to further boost the nation's sanitation and water access.

Currently, Cambodia boasts a commendable water and sanitation coverage rate of 92%, with 89% access to basic water supply and 95% to basic rural sanitation. Additionally, 21 capitals and provinces have achieved Open Defecation Free (ODF) PLUS and ODF status, marking a significant milestone in public health and hygiene standards.

This groundbreaking initiative is set to enhance the quality of life for countless Cambodians, demonstrating the government's commitment to sustainable development in rural areas.

In a significant step towards enhancing rural sanitation and water supply, the Royal Government of Cambodia has officially launched a comprehensive development program valued at over USD 95 million. The announcement was made by Mr. Tith Sopha, Deputy Secretary-General and Program Director, during a groundbreaking ceremony for new water and sanitation infrastructure in Stung Treng province.

The program, designed to bolster sustainable rural water supply and sanitation, is backed by a substantial budget, including a government contribution of USD 2.14 million and a generous grant from the Asian Development Bank (ADB) amounting to USD 93 million. Notably, a segment of this funding,

Cambodia Set to Launch First Wind Power Plant in Mondulkiri Province by 2026

In a significant move toward sustainable energy, Cambodia is preparing to inaugurate its first wind power plant in Mondulkiri province, with an initial capacity of 150 megawatts expected to be operational in 2026. This announcement was made during a recent meeting of alumni from the Electricity of Cambodia, chaired by Minister of Mines and Energy Keo Rattanak.

Dr. Prang Jalsa, the Royal Government of Cambodia's delegate and General Director of Electricity of Cambodia, revealed ambitious plans for the region. He confirmed that the wind power project is part of a broader initiative, which will ultimately see Mondulkiri host a 900-megawatt wind power plant, bolstered by ongoing developments in other renewable energy sources.

The Minister emphasized that the government is committed to achieving at least 70% clean and green energy by 2030, with a long-term vision of becoming carbon neutral by 2050. "This project is not just about energy production; it's about preserving our environment and securing a sustainable future for our planet," he stated.

As of August 2025, Cambodia's national system has met a maximum annual electricity demand of 3,371 megawatts, with total generation nearing 3,400 megawatts, which includes small imports from neighboring Vietnam and Laos.

At the heart of this renewable energy initiative is the French company Blue Circle. Since it opened its first office in Phnom Penh in 2015, Blue Circle has been at the forefront of developing, financing, and operating renewable energy projects in Southeast Asia. The choice of Mondulkiri province for this groundbreaking wind power conversion project underscores the region's potential for renewable energy development.

As Cambodia gears up for this monumental step in its energy journey, the nation is poised to redefine its energy landscape and contribute to global sustainability efforts. The launch of this wind power plant is a testament to the country's determination to embrace renewable energy and combat climate change.

UDONG MECHEY CITY TO WELCOME USD 6 MILLION SPORTS EQUIPMENT FACTORY


The Council for the Development of Cambodia (CDC) has officially registered the investment project from HORIZON PRIME (CAMBODIA) CO., LTD, confirming the factory will be situated in Damnak Smach village, within the Veal Pong Sangkat area of Udong Mechey.

This investment marks a notable addition to the region's burgeoning industrial landscape. Over the first seven months of 2025, a record 440 investment projects have been approved, totaling around USD 6.7 billion – a figure that surpasses the entire investment tally for 2024 and represents the highest approval rate in over 30 years since the CDC's inception.



With this new factory, local authorities anticipate not only a boost in employment but also an enhancement of the local economy, aligning with the government's ongoing efforts to attract foreign investment and develop the infrastructure in Kampong Speu province.

As the project moves forward, the community eagerly awaits the positive changes it will bring, paving the way for further investment and growth in the region.



KRATIE PROVINCE SEES GROWTH IN EMPLOYMENT AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

As of September 2025, Kratie province boasts a total of 243 factories and enterprises, generating nearly 19,400 jobs for local residents. This significant achievement was highlighted during a meeting between HE Heng Sotha, Deputy Governor of Kratie, and the Indonesian Ambassador to Cambodia.

During the meeting, HE Heng Sotha emphasized the diverse economic landscape of Kratie. The province is home to 24 cultural and historical sites, along with vibrant eco-tourism communities that showcase its rich natural heritage. In addition to tourism, the provincial economy is bolstered by 162 companies in the trade and industry-handicraft sector, as well as a dedicated dry port to facilitate trade.

Moreover, Kratie features a special economic zone aimed at promoting investment and economic activity. The workforce is predominantly local, with

19,391 individuals employed across various sectors, including 1,042 foreign workers contributing their skills.

Covering an extensive area of 11,094 square kilometers, Kratie is organized into 7 cities, 48 districts, and 327 communes, complemented by 2 border gates enhancing transportation capabilities. The agriculture-agro-industrial sector is also thriving, housing 48 investment companies along with 24,000 cattle farms. In the mining and energy sector, 72 companies are operational, including a notable gold mining project backed by a Chinese investor. Furthermore, the management and distribution of electricity are progressing well, with coverage extending to 297 villages, achieving a supply rate of 90.83%.

The meeting concluded with the Indonesian Embassy reaffirming its commitment to foster cooperation with Kratie province, focusing on enhancing trade links and expanding export-import activities between the two nations to elevate their economic partnership.

This collaborative approach is expected to not only strengthen local economies but also create more job opportunities and improve the overall quality of life in Kratie province.



GOVERNMENT UNVEILS PLANS FOR AGRO-INDUSTRIAL ZONES IN WESTERN CAMBODIA

In a significant boost for the economy of western Cambodia, Prime Minister Hun Manet announced on 1 July 2025, the establishment of agro-industrial zones in Battambang, Banteay Meanchey, and Pursat provinces. This decision was made during his speech at the National Fishery Day celebration in Takeo province.

The Prime Minister directed the National Policy Committee to prepare for the development of these zones, emphasizing the importance of fostering economic growth and enhancing export capabilities in these regions. He highlighted that the initiative is part of a broader strategy to strengthen Cambodia's agro-industrial sector by creating a supportive policy framework and infrastructure.

PM further noted that the investment policy for the agro-industrial sector is particularly aimed at regions grappling with challenges related to Thailand. He stated that enhancing local production and processing capacities will empower Cambodian farmers and producers, allowing them to stand independently in the global market.

In addition to the agro-industrial zones, the government is committed to improving infrastructure in these areas to ensure a more vibrant economic environment. The Prime Minister also urged relevant ministries to prioritize the processing of local products, such as vegetables and meat, to meet domestic demands and reduce dependency on imports.

The announcement comes at a time when global geopolitical tensions and economic challenges are prevalent. The Cambodian government is determined to navigate these obstacles and maintain sustainable economic growth for its citizens, making the establishment of agro-industrial zones a timely and strategic move.

As the country moves forward with this initiative, the focus remains on enhancing the livelihoods of the people in Battambang, Banteay Meanchey, and Pursat, paving the way for a more robust economy in western Cambodia.

DANG KAMBIT RESERVOIR DEVELOPMENT PROJECT SURPASSES 63% COMPLETION IN KAMPONG THOM PROVINCE

The Dang Kambit Reservoir Dam construction project in Sre Khsach Village, Sandan District, has reached an impressive 63.2% completion, as confirmed by a recent progress inspection led by H.E. Chuon Bithol, Undersecretary of State at the Ministry of Water Resources and Meteorology.

During the inspection, H.E. Bithol outlined the detailed progress of the project, which is set to enhance water supply and irrigation in the region. Key milestones include:

- Spillway Construction: Phase 1 completed at 100% and Phase 2 at 60%
- Non-Spillway Construction: 55% complete
- Left Earth Dam: Completed at 95%
- Right Earth Dam: 70% complete
- Phase 1 Floodgate: Completed at 100%

The Dang Kambit Reservoir Development Project commenced on 8 December 2023, and is scheduled for completion in October 2027, a timeline of 48 months. The ambitious infrastructure features a 2,680-meter-long dam comprising a 1,136-meter-long earth dam, a 50-meter concrete dam, a 306-meter spillway dam, and a 1,188-meter right earth dam.



Once operational, the project is expected to significantly benefit the local communities, providing irrigation resources to approximately 25,000 farming families, or about 85,300 individuals across Baray, Kampong Svay, Prasat Sambor, Sandan, Santuk, and Stoung districts. It is projected to irrigate around 131,323 hectares of rice fields, enhancing yields from 4 tons to an impressive 5.4 tons per hectare. Additionally, the reservoir will contribute to clean water access and flood mitigation in the area.

Financed through concessional loans from the Export-Import Bank of China (EXIMBANK) via the Ministry of Economy and Finance, the Dang Kambit Reservoir project is also classified as a priority initiative in the Finance Law for Management 2023.

With this development, the Kampong Thom Province looks forward to a brighter agricultural future and improved water management systems. Stay tuned for further updates as the project progresses.



KOREA ENHANCES CONSTRUCTION SAFETY STANDARDS FOR CAMBODIAN OFFICIALS

In a significant step towards improving workplace safety in the construction sector, the Korea Occupational Safety and Health Agency, in collaboration with the International Labor Organization (ILO-Korea), has successfully conducted a training course for Cambodian officials focused on construction safety and health.

Held in the Republic of Korea, the training brought together ten representatives, including five officials from Cambodia's Department of Occupational Health within the Ministry of Labor and Vocational Training, as well as five representatives from the Ministry of Land, Urban Planning and Construction. The course, which concluded on 17 July 2025, aimed at equipping these officials with the essential knowledge and skills needed to enhance occupational safety and health practices back home.


Throughout the program, participants explored various aspects of occupa-

tional safety in the construction sector, including relevant laws, regulations, and policies that shape Korea's safety framework. The training not only bolstered the understanding of these officials but also facilitated valuable exchanges of experiences and best practices in the field.

Furthermore, the Cambodian experts had the opportunity to learn from Korea's advanced occupational safety and health (OSH) systems by comparing them with their own. The curriculum included in-depth studies of international laws and conventions on safety, alongside practical insights into effective safety inspection measures, accident investigations, and preventive strategies aimed at reducing workplace accidents.

A highlight of the training was direct exposure to construction sites across Korea. This hands-on experience allowed the Cambodian officials to observe the implementation of safety protocols and gain firsthand knowledge of how occupational health systems operate to protect workers in real-world scenarios.

This initiative represents a pivotal effort to bolster safety standards in Cambodia's construction industry, ultimately leading to healthier and more secure working conditions for all construction workers.



Government Unveils Takhmao Water Treatment Plant and Koh Nora Pumping Station

In a significant boost for clean water access in the capital, the Cambodian government officially inaugurated the Takhmao Water Treatment Plant and the Koh Nora Raw Water Pumping Station today. The ceremony was led by H.E. Vongsey Visoth, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister in Charge of the Council of Ministers, alongside H.E. UENO Atsushi, Japan's Ambassador to Cambodia. The projects represent a collective investment of over USD 50 million.

These key infrastructure developments are designed to enhance the supply of clean water to the southern districts of Phnom Penh and the neighboring Takhmao city. The Takhmao Water Treatment Plant, funded through a Japanese grant-aid initiative, utilizes innovative land-saving technology from Japan and boasts a production capacity of 30,000 cubic meters of clean water per day. This will significantly contribute to increasing the Phnom Penh Autonomous Water Supply Authority's (PWPWSA) total clean water production capacity to over 1 million cubic meters per day.

Construction of the Takhmao Water Treatment Plant commenced in March 2022 and was completed in July 2025 by the KKKCT consortium from Japan, under the auspices of the PWPWSA. The project was

made possible through a grant of 3.421 million yen (approximately USD 23.25 million) from Japan via the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), with all associated taxes and duties assumed by the Cambodian government.

In addition to the water treatment plant, the newly inaugurated Koh Nora Raw Water Pumping Station will significantly benefit the region. This USD 28 million facility is part of a strategic partnership between OCIC and the PWPWSA, aimed at offsetting the impacts of the Koh Nora development project on the authority's desalinated water production capabilities. The pumping station is designed to pump 460,000 cubic meters of raw water daily, supporting both current and future desalinated water plants serving residential, commercial, and major development areas, including the Techo International Airport zone.

These projects mark a crucial step forward in ensuring sustainable access to clean water for the people of Phnom Penh and surrounding areas, underlining the government's commitment to improving infrastructure and enhancing the quality of life for its citizens.




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
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

Water Diversion System Nears Completion in Cambodia

The ambitious water diversion system project linking Phnom Penh and the satellite areas of Kampong Speu province is on the verge of completion, reaching nearly 100% progress. His Excellency Tho Jetha, Minister of Water Resources and Meteorology, confirmed these developments during an inspection visit to the Stung Toch Dam construction site on August 28.

According to Minister Tho Jetha, the water diversion project from Phnom Penh, specifically at the Stung Toch Dam site, has achieved an impressive completion rate of 97%. He emphasized the importance of maintaining high technical standards and urged the construction teams to remain focused to ensure all aspects of the project are executed as planned.


The Stung Toch Dam sub-project features significant infrastructure improvements, including the restoration of a 51-kilometer stretch of the dam and the construction of a new structure measuring 8

meters in height, 51 meters in width, and 300 meters in length. In Phnom Penh, the Mechoeung Canal System sub-project is also well underway, featuring the development of three Cheongsang Canals spanning approximately 27.5 kilometers, alongside the establishment of two new pumping stations: Anlong Kong Pumping Station and Sak Sampov Station.

The Ministry of Water Resources is diligently advancing the Water Release and Diversion System Project, which encompasses both Phases 1 and 2. This comprehensive initiative includes 10 sub-projects dedicated to rehabilitating 10 rivers and canals, with a total length of around 260 kilometers, and constructing 366 various infrastructural features.

As the project nears completion, it promises to enhance water management capabilities and improve the overall infrastructure of the region, contributing significantly to the development of Kampong Speu and its surrounding areas.

AIIB Enhances Cooperation with Cambodia on Social Infrastructure Projects

The Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) has expressed its commitment to boosting investment cooperation with Cambodia, particularly in social infrastructure development. This initiative aims to support and strengthen the Cambodian economy.

He noted ongoing projects, such as the construction of a new international airport and the Funan Techo Canal project, which are designed to propel the growth of the industrial and logistics sectors. Furthermore, he underscored the Royal Government's commitment to investing in human capital development, aiming to equip the workforce with essential skills to meet the evolving demands of Cambodia's industrial sector, both now and in the future.

Agro King Plans Major Purchase of Cambodian Agricultural Products for Export to Vietnam

In a significant move for the agricultural sector, Agro King Trading Co., Ltd. has announced its intent to purchase four types of Cambodian agricultural products for export to Vietnam. This initiative aims to strengthen trade ties between the two neighboring countries and boost the local economy.

The announcement was made by His Excellency Ky Chanromduol, Undersecretary of State at the Ministry of Agriculture, during a coordination meeting for Agro King's purchasing and selling operations in Pailin province on 29 August 2025.

Agro King, a subsidiary of Hong Nga Saigon Co., Ltd., plans to export substantial quantities of cassava, red corn, cashew nuts, and soybeans from Cambodia to Vietnam. The company is set up to order an impressive 500,000 tons of red corn, 30,000 tons of peeled and hand-cut cassava, along with 2,000 tons each of cashew nuts and soybeans annually.


In his remarks, His Excellency Ky Chanromduol emphasized the need for the Pailin Provincial Department of Agriculture to actively promote and develop business plans that align with Agro King's

purchase specifications, ensuring clear contracts are in place for all transactions.

This announcement comes at a time when trade statistics reveal a positive trend in Cambodia's exports to Vietnam. In the first seven months of 2025, Cambodia exported approximately USD 3.8 billion worth of goods to Vietnam, outstripping imports from Vietnam, which totaled around USD 3.2 billion. The two countries are complementing each other in the trade sector, with Cambodia serving as a source of raw materials and Vietnam functioning as a processing hub.

The cooperative efforts were further emphasized by Samdech Techo Hun Sen in a recent meeting with H.E. To Lam, General Secretary of the Communist Party of Vietnam, underscoring the importance of collaboration in fostering economic growth and stability in the region.

As Agro King moves forward with its purchasing plans, the agricultural landscape in Cambodia stands poised for growth, presenting new opportunities for local farmers and exporters alike.



Government Secures USD 196 Million in New Concessional Loans as of Q2 2025

The Royal Government of Cambodia has recently signed new concessional loans amounting to a significant US\$196 million with various development partners, as reported in the latest release from the Ministry of Economy and Finance.

As of the second quarter of 2025, these loans represent a crucial financial inflow aimed at bolstering public investment projects across key sectors essential for promoting sustainable economic growth and enhancing productivity. The agreement highlights a particular emphasis on partnerships with multilateral development organizations, with 100% of the loans secured through such channels.

However, the recent figures indicate a notable decrease in the volume of loans signed during the first half of 2025, dropping approximately 37% compared to the same period the previous year. This decline poses questions about funding dynamics amid evolving economic conditions.

According to the ministry's report, the total new concessional loans are equivalent to approximately SDR 142.31 million, which constitutes 7% of the legal ceiling permitted by law (SDR 2,000 million). These loans are characterized by a high degree of concessionality, featuring an average grant element of around 36%, indicating favorable terms for the borrowing government.

"The purpose of these newly signed loans is to finance public investment projects in priority sectors that support long-term sustainable economic growth and increase economic productivity," emphasized the Ministry of Economy and Finance.

As Cambodia navigates these financial challenges, the government remains focused on leveraging international partnerships to stimulate economic progress and address pressing developmental needs.

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Impact Report 2024: How Bentley Systems Is Helping Make the World and Our Infrastructure More Sustainable and Resilient

Nothing is certain except death and taxes, the cliché goes. But even taxes come with surprises—like the cost of crumbling infrastructure.

“When we fail to invest in infrastructure, that’s a hidden tax we pay today,” said Tom Smith, executive director of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE). “Instead of paying a real tax that would produce something, we’re paying in response to infrastructure that is non-performing.” Smith estimates this hidden tax costs each American family around \$2,000 a year—and could increase to \$2,700 “if we fail to continue the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act investments that we have today.”

Smith spoke at the recent Transforming Infrastructure Performance (TIP) forum in New York City, a global gathering seeking to “bring together the best minds in infrastructure.” Attendees included Maryland Lt. Gov. Aruna Miller, who spoke about the effort to rebuild the Francis Scott Key Bridge in Baltimore; Uzoamaka N. Okoye, chief of staff for the New Terminal One at JFK airport, who discussed the complexities and challenges of building a brand-new terminal at one of the world’s busiest airports while keeping flights running; and Tom Curtin, senior policy advisor at the investment firm Meridiam, who talked about funding sustainable and resilient infrastructure projects in the U.S. and around the world.

“The U.S. is improving its infrastructure, but challenges remain,” summarized Rory Linehan, director for infrastructure policy advancement at Bentley Systems, the global infrastructure engineering software company that organized the forum. “We’ll overcome them by keeping communities at the heart of every project and through innovation like digital technologies, AI, and digital twins.”

Ross Van Dongen, chief of infrastructure and workforce development at United for Infrastructure, said we need forums like TIP to highlight innovation, because the only time people talk about infrastructure “is when it’s not working. We need to tell people that orange cones indicate that we’re building a future that will make everything more seamless.”

Miller set the tone early in the day, when she used her session to record an episode of the Infrastructure Podcast with journalist Anthony Oliver. Speaking about innovation, the lieutenant governor said “one of the misconceptions about engineering is that it’s not a very creative field.” Miller was speaking from experience—she has a degree in civil engineering. She said both engineering and public service are trying to meet the needs of the community and come up with solutions. “Engineers may do it a little differently, and policy makers do it by passing laws that really change lives for the better of people, but both of them have the same focus,” Miller said. “Infrastructure is about people; it’s not about concrete and steel.”



Still, she told Oliver that new technologies were changing infrastructure and that artificial intelligence (AI), for example, could play a big role in sequencing construction tasks.

For the JFK airport project, making sure that the right construction steps take place in the right order is very much on Okoye's mind. "We're in between two operating terminals, so there's a lot of logistics and planning that has had to happen," she said, starting with tasks like getting 2,100 workers to the construction site. Speaking to Bentley after her panel about JFK's New Terminal One, she said her teams are using software to manage scheduling and logistics. "We have an entire model that shows where you're building, what you're building," she said. The site is also being continuously recorded on video, and the team can do split-screen comparisons between reality and the model. "One of the things I love to see is to have them side by side," she said.

Jamie Torres-Springer, president of the Metropolitan Transportation Authority's Construction and Development division, is also relying on digital technology to maintain New York City's transportation network, which moves some 5 million riders every weekday. Consider that the city's subway system, which operates around the clock, has some 665 miles of track and 472 stations. His division is using technology to consolidate its systems. "We're putting a backbone in place that we can use as a project management information system and then plugging in the different modules that we need to manage," he said. "While we're

doing that, we're bringing lots of dashboards together. BIM and digital twins for projects becomes a very important element of that."

Using digital technology to see the big picture is top of mind for people financing infrastructure projects, like Curtin, the senior policy advisor at Meridiam. "We think in generations," Curtin said. "On time and on budget is important, but what we're investing in has to stand the test of time." Curtin believes that the role of private capital is to help build resilient and sustainable infrastructure and to continually drive innovation. "Private capital, I think, unlocks the possibilities for managing our infrastructure over a time period that will be far beyond any of us."

Resilient and sustainable infrastructure could also help us save a lot of money. ASCE's Smith said that every dollar proactively invested in a resilient bridge, road, or other infrastructure asset could save us \$13 in costs responding to an extreme weather event. He said high-performing and efficient infrastructure is important for the global economy, for our way of life, and for creating jobs. "It's important for our nation. And if we fail to do that, we pay this tax."

"When it comes to infrastructure, we really don't have a choice," Smith added. "You can't solve poverty and bring people out of those conditions without highly functioning infrastructure. Roads, broadband, transportation networks, clean water—all those things are necessary for our quality of life."

Building at a Whole New Scale: This Engineer is Taking Construction into the Fourth Dimension With 'Godzilla Mode'

James Bowles has always loved building things. As a child, he spent hours with Lego, piecing together miniature cities brick by brick. As a teenager, he became fascinated by skyscrapers—their design, engineering, and sheer scale. It wasn't just their height that intrigued him, but the challenge of making something so ambitious stand.

Today, Bowles is helping shape the skylines he once admired, revolutionizing construction planning with 4D modeling, which connects time and space, and digital twins. His work bridges the visionary concepts of architects with the practical expertise of builders, ensuring that complex structures rise with fewer surprises. Now in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, Bowles is helping bring to life the kind of architectural ambition that first captivated him—the tallest skyscraper the world has ever seen.

Falling in Love with the Build

Bowles pursued his passion at the University of Sheffield, enrolling in one of the U.K.'s rare dual-degree programs in architecture and engineering. The courses demanded a balance of structural problem-solving by day and creative design work by night, giving him a foundation in both disciplines.

He went on to join BAM Construction in 1999, where he started in the design office. "It was a classic office environment, with engineers sitting quietly, working diligently," he recalls. It was fine as far as it went, but everything changed

the day Bowles was seconded to a construction site.

"Suddenly I was working as a site engineer in a construction team of hundreds, surrounded by tower cranes, excavators, and piling rigs. Banter over a quick bacon sandwich, the team spirit—everything just clicked." Bowles was hooked. "I remember thinking, 'I'm helping to build Great Ormond Street Hospital, and they're paying me to do it? This is crazy.'" This was Lego with real-world impact, and he would have done it for free.

The Darwin Centre: The Power of 3D Models

One of Bowles' most technically demanding projects at BAM was the build of Darwin Centre Phase II at the Natural History Museum in London. The project included an eight-story, curving concrete cocoon encased within the outer shell of the building. The structure's freeform shape made it difficult to convey using traditional plans. "It was impossible to understand in 2D," says Bowles.

To help coordinate the build, which began in 2006, Bowles was asked to create a 4D model using design software. "It was a bit of a hack," he says. "We built a model with elements that could be toggled on and off in sequence, creating a stop-motion-style animation—like flipping through a Lego manual for the build."

It worked. Construction teams used Bowles' visualizations daily, coordinating everything from scaffold placements to concrete sprays, and he emerged from that cocoon with his

outlook transformed. He'd seen the power of digital construction planning as a way to visualize and de-risk construction before it happened—and his evolution was set.

The Founding of Freeform

After finishing the Darwin Centre, Bowles became evangelical about using models to improve construction planning. But in these early days of the technology, it was an undervalued part of the industry. "There was no obvious role for me to keep doing it inside BAM," he says. So, without a business plan or any guaranteed work, he left and ultimately founded Freeform in 2007.

For its first few years, Freeform manually built sequencing models, which connect construction schedules and other important engineering contexts to 3D design models, using whatever software they could bend to their purpose. Then Bowles discovered SYNCHRO 4D. "This whole hack we'd been doing—this was the tool actually built for it," he says. "It was perfect."

Now part of Bentley Systems, the infrastructure engineering software company, SYNCHRO also allowed Freeform to connect construction schedules and activities directly to 3D models, enabling teams to visualize the build over time. No more workarounds—now, they could create true 4D models, dynamically linking time and space.

Early on, the models were focused on planning. "It wasn't so much about communication with the workforce, and so we weren't getting the expertise from the people actually fitting the steel—which would have been helpful," he says. That changed as Freeform refined its approach and used more of SYNCHRO's growing capabilities. Bowles' models began incorporating access routes, hoisting logistics, formwork, and concrete pouring sequences, making the technology indispensable for the entire project lifecycle. Most

importantly, SYNCHRO enabled seamless collaboration—bringing together engineers, planners, and site workers to visualize construction in a shared digital space.

That shift was about to pay off in a big way.

Crossrail: The Power of Getting People in the Room

One of Freeform's major successes with SYNCHRO came in 2012 with Crossrail. The massive rail project, now known as the Elizabeth Line, installed 118 kilometers (73 miles) of tracks under London and connected its suburbs in the east to center and to Heathrow Airport in the west. Passengers have already taken hundreds of millions of trips on the underground line since it opened in 2022.

At Moorgate shaft, a pivotal excavation, Bowles was leading a planning review using an animated SYNCHRO model when something remarkable happened. A mini-digger operator with 30 years' experience sat in on the session. As Bowles ran through the construction sequence, the operator pointed at the screen. "He said: 'Yeah, you can physically put me in that hole, but I'll be in there for six months,'" Bowles recalls.

On paper, the plan looked fine. In practice, the Bobcat digger wouldn't have had enough space to properly maneuver. The constraints would have turned a routine excavation into a months-long bottleneck—except that, crucially, this review was happening before construction materials had even been fabricated. "We took the issue straight to the engineers," Bowles says. "They redesigned the shaft to remove the obstacles. We avoided six months of delays and saved roughly seven figures in costs—just by having the right person in the room, looking at the right model, at the right time."

For Bowles, those "golden moments" of collaboration,

as he calls them, are what make 4D modelling so powerful. Construction has long relied on fragmented information and century-old planning methods. “Henry Gantt died over a hundred years ago—but we’re still using Gantt charts to manage risk and time on projects,” says Bowles. “In the era of digital twins, this traditional approach is no longer sufficient.”

Pushing the Boundaries: 22 Bishopsgate

As Freeform’s expertise grew, so did the ambition of its models. The Elizabeth Line work had demonstrated the power of digital planning, but in 2014 at 22 Bishopsgate—the second tallest building in the U.K.—they took things to a new level.

Multiplex, the construction firm leading the project, was highly technical and forward-thinking, says Bowles. “They had a first-class planning and BIM team, and they wanted us to use SYNCHRO to model everything: the initial demolition, the steel work, the frame, the slip core, and how the basement would integrate with the remnants of The Pinnacle, the abandoned skyscraper that once stood on-site.”

By rendering their SYNCHRO models using Unreal Engine and Unity game engines, Freeform enabled VR-headset experiences that let stakeholders step inside the digital construction site before a single beam was installed. The flexibility of VR also introduced new ways to experience scale.

“We built in a function we called ‘Godzilla mode,’” Bowles says. “You could zoom out to the size of Godzilla and see the entire tower, with NatWest, the Gherkin, and the rest of the skyline around you. Then, using a hand controller to drop a pin, you could instantly shrink down and place yourself on, say, the 62nd floor at one-to-one scale, seeing the view of the river just as it would be in real life.”

The impact was huge. It stretched the capabilities of 4D modeling beyond scheduling and coordination, turning it into an interactive decision-making tool. This wasn’t just about building a better plan—it was about experiencing the construction process before it happened.

For Freeform, 22 Bishopsgate was a milestone. It wasn’t just their most comprehensive model to date—it was proof that VR and digital twins were transforming how the most advanced teams visualized and executed construction.


Jeddah Tower: Building the Future

Now, Freeform is tackling arguably its most ambitious project yet: Jeddah Tower in Saudi Arabia. When completed, at 1-kilometer tall, it will be the tallest building in the world—a structure that puts even the skyscrapers of Bowles’ youth in the shade.

The tower’s 167 floors and tapering, Y-shaped structure will ultimately weigh in at around a million tons. Coordinating its construction is a monumental challenge, requiring

meticulous sequencing of materials, labor, and logistics across multiple international suppliers. “It’s a complicated, challenging, ambitious project, at the limit of what’s possible,” Bowles says.

Jeddah Tower has been under construction for years, but as the next phases ramp up, Freeform has been brought in to help optimize planning and execution with SYNCHRO. “We’ve digitally rehearsed, and rehearsed, and rehearsed every crane lift, every concrete pour, every steel placement—so when it happens on-site, there are no surprises,” Bowles explains.

“It’s all about collaboration and common ground,” he says. “If you build the models correctly and with enough content, there’s no room for interpretation: Everyone sees the same thing, knows the sequence, and understands exactly what’s coming next.”

This level of foresight is critical—not just for efficiency, but for safety. By identifying risks in the virtual model before crews ever step on site, the team can plan around potential hazards, reducing the chances of last-minute improvisation that could lead to accidents.

Jeddah Tower is more than another project for Bowles; it’s the ultimate skyscraper challenge, the kind of architectural ambition that first captured his young imagination. “This is Big Lego at the highest level,” he says.

Human Connection is Everything

For all its scale, the project is also a sign of how far construction has come—and where it’s heading next. Digital twins, 4D planning, and immersive simulations aren’t just innovations anymore; they’re shaping the future of how things get built.

Every major project is a series of thousands of decisions, each driven by the expertise of engineers, planners, and tradespeople. In the past, that siloed knowledge was scattered across spreadsheets and schedules. Now, the right tools bring it into focus—turning fragmented insights into a shared vision.

Bowles knows that software doesn’t build skyscrapers—people do. “I’ve been lucky to work with some amazing planners who understand that planning is a team sport. It’s not about creating a big schedule and just distributing it—it’s about getting the right people in the room and working through everything together.”



Cambodia Sees Surge in Investment Projects in First Half of 2025

In a notable boost to its economic landscape, Cambodia approved a total of 373 new investment projects in the first half of 2025, amassing an impressive investment capital of USD 5.8 billion. This marks a substantial 77% increase compared to the same period last year, according to a report released by the Council for the Development of Cambodia (CDC) on 7 July 2025.

The new projects are projected to create approximately 255,000 jobs for Cambodian citizens. Of the approved projects, 216 are situated outside special economic zones, while 157 are located within these designated areas.

The report further highlighted that the total number of approved projects has risen by 183, while the investment capital has increased by around USD 2.5 billion compared to the first half of 2024. This trend underscores the growing potential of Cambodia's industrial sector, which has attracted a remarkable USD 4.2 billion in investment.

Infrastructure and other sectors follow with USD 1.5 billion, whereas agriculture and tourism received USD 130 million and USD 20 million, respectively.

In terms of investment sources, China leads the way, contributing 52.23% of the total capital in the first half of 2025. Following China, domestic investment from Cambodia itself accounted for 29.76%, with Singapore rounding out the top three at 7.72%.

Notably, the CDC reported that June alone saw the approval of 83 projects with a total investment capital of USD 1.6 billion. Domestic capital flows from Cambodia were significant, making up 46.79% of this total investment, indicating a robust commitment to local economic development.

These developments reflect a positive economic outlook for Cambodia as it continues to attract significant foreign and domestic investments, positioning itself as a key player in the region's growth.

Malaysian Business Association Pursues Investment Opportunities in Key Sectors in Cambodia

A delegation from the Malaysia-Cambodia Business Association (MCBA) recently convened with Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Manet to explore promising investment and trade opportunities across various key sectors in the Kingdom.

Dato' Sri Dr. Ricky Yaw, President of the MCBA, highlighted the mission of the visit as a pivotal step towards strengthening economic ties between Malaysia and Cambodia. "Our focus is on identifying investment avenues in critical areas such as agriculture, advanced services, and infrastructure, while fostering partnerships that can enhance bilateral cooperation," he stated during the meeting.

The delegation's discussions follow a productive engagement with His Excellency Sun Chanthol on May 2, where two Malaysian firms, Malakoff Corporation Berhad (MCB) and GAEA PLC, expressed keen interest in tapping into Cambodia's ports,

Their focus areas span infrastructure, renewable energy, healthcare, and the burgeoning digital sector, signaling a robust commitment to realizing economic potential in the region.

As both nations aim to deepen their economic relations, the visits and discussions highlight Malaysia's strategic interest in fostering long-term partnerships that could benefit both economies in the fast-evolving Southeast Asian landscape.

Cambodian Government Approves 21 New Standards to Enhance Industrial Competitiveness

In a significant move to bolster industrial growth, the Cambodian government has approved 21 new international standards aimed at enhancing the country's competitiveness. This decision was announced during the 31st meeting of the National Standards Council, led by H.E. Hem Vandy, Minister of Industry, Science, Technology, and Innovation, on September 2025.

The newly approved standards encompass a range of areas, including chemical substances and products, energy management systems, electrical and electronic products, automotive parts, cosmetics, bamboo furniture, and textiles. These standards, which include ISO, IEC, and ISO/IEC classifications, are expected to lay a strong foundation for Cambodia's manufacturing capabilities.

H.E. Hem Vandy emphasized the importance of these standards, stating, "These standards are crucial for advancing and strengthening Cambodia's manufacturing sovereignty. They reflect our national unity and the commitment to support local produc-

tion." He further noted that adherence to these standards would enable Cambodian businesses to integrate into both domestic and global supply chains while ensuring public health, consumer safety, and overall industrial competitiveness.

In addition to the approval of the new standards, the National Standards Council has also established three national committees tasked with coordinating and promoting Cambodia's participation in international standardization efforts under the auspices of organizations such as ISO, IEC, and Codex. This initiative aligns with Cambodia's goal to become a full member of the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) and an associate member of the IEC by 2026.

The implementation of these standards represents a pivotal step forward for Cambodia, poised to enhance its industrial landscape and boost economic development in the years to come.

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

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

In response, Prime Minister Hun Manet expressed gratitude towards the US Congress and the US government for their decision to lower the import tariff

rate on Cambodian goods to 19%, effective August 1, 2025. He emphasized Cambodia's initiatives, including improved investment registration procedures, the establishment of a government-private sector forum to address challenges, and the introduction of attractive incentive measures for foreign investors.

This commitment to enhance trade cooperation was also echoed by Ms. Bridgette L. Walker, Chargé d'Affaires of the US Embassy in Cambodia, during the 75th anniversary celebration of Cambodia-US diplomatic relations on 3 July 2025.

Notably, in the first five months of 2025, trade between Cambodia and its partners exceeded USD 25 billion, marking an 18.5% increase compared to the same period in 2024. Notably, trade volume with the United States reached an impressive USD 4.4 million, reflecting an increase of 27%.

CAMBODIA STREAMLINES REAL ESTATE PROCEDURES WITH ONLINE SERVICES

In a significant move aimed at simplifying real estate transactions, the Cambodian government has announced that all procedures related to buying, selling, proposing, or transferring property will no longer require the involvement of village heads and commune heads.

The announcement was made by HE Say Samal, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Ministry of Land Management, Urban Planning and Construction, in a brief video posted on the ministry's Facebook page on July 4, 2025.

In his statement, HE Say Samal emphasized that the government's decision to implement online services is designed to make real estate transactions more accessible for Cambodian citizens. "By moving these processes online, we aim to provide a more efficient and user-friendly service," he remarked.



This new approach follows an agreement between the Ministry of Land Management and the Ministry of Interior to eliminate the requirement for signatures from local commune and village heads. While the majority of real estate transactions will now be handled online, the government has noted that certain services may still necessitate in-person visits.

The Ministry of Land Management is confident that this system will not only enhance convenience for citizens but also align Cambodia with global standards, as many countries have already transitioned to similar digital platforms for real estate procedures.

This development marks a significant step towards modernizing Cambodia's real estate sector and offering a more streamlined experience for property transactions.



CAMBODIA'S TOURISM INDUSTRY SEES REMARKABLE GROWTH IN EARLY 2025

H.E. Sin Chansereyvutha, the Secretary of State and Spokesperson for Civil Aviation, attributed this remarkable growth to several factors: an increase in Chinese tourists traveling abroad, sustained regional air travel demand—particularly from Thailand, Vietnam, Korea, and Japan—and the easing of travel restrictions along with the strengthening of airline operations.

Notably, June recorded a slight dip in attendance, with 40,096 foreign tourists visiting Angkor, which brought in USD 1,747,197—a decrease of 18.77% compared to June 2024.



As the industry continues to recover and expand, Cambodia is poised for a promising future in tourism, appealing to diverse audiences eager to explore its unique offerings.

The Cambodian tourism sector has reported impressive growth in the first half of 2025, with over USD 27 million generated from ticket sales to its famed attractions. The Angkor Foundation revealed that a total of 567,673 foreign tourists visited iconic sites like Angkor Wat, contributing USD 26,316,221 to the nation's economy—a significant 8.04% increase compared to the same period last year.

In addition to ticket sales for Angkor, the Foundation reported supplementary earnings of USD 1,109,072 from other popular destinations, including Koh Ker, Beng Mealea, and Phnom Kbal Spean, as well as boat ride experiences.

The surge in tourism is being felt at the airports as well, with more than 3.4 million passengers traveling through Cambodia's three international airports in the first six months, marking a 16% rise over the same timeframe last year, according to the Civil Aviation Authority.



Saudi Arabia and Cambodia Strengthen Investment Ties Across Key Sectors

Government Launches Peace Villages Project in Pailin Province with KOICA Support

The Ministry of Rural Development proudly inaugurated the Peace Villages Project today, a vital initiative aimed at bolstering integrated rural communities in Pailin Province, funded by the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA) with a generous grant of approximately \$10 million.

The inauguration ceremony, attended by His Excellency Chhay Rithsen, the Minister of Rural Development, celebrated the successful implementation of this project across 30 target villages in three provinces: Battambang (6 villages), Banteay Meanchey (12 villages), and Pailin (12 villages).

Mr. Nom Saroet, a representative of the Project Management Advisor, highlighted the achievements of the Peace Villages Project, citing the construction of five rural roads spanning a total of 2,800 meters, alongside three artistic structures and spillways measuring 90 meters in total length and 5 meters in width. Key infrastructure improvements also include three community drinking water production stations

that provide 60 cubic meters of drinking water daily, as well as an expanded community water distribution network stretching 2,350 meters. The project has also led to the establishment of three community kindergartens, various sanitation facilities, and a 360-meter concrete fence for enhanced safety.

Minister Chhay Rithsen announced the recognition of 30 model villages amidst the ceremony, and plans are in motion to develop an additional 34 "model villages," including 30 designated as "peace villages" and four following a new village movement model. Furthermore, the ministry aims to select 50 villages across both urban and rural areas for the model village initiative, targeting the establishment of at least 230 model villages across the country by 2028.

This ambitious effort to cultivate peaceful villages through comprehensive rural development will continue until 2026, ensuring sustainable growth and community enrichment throughout the region.

CAMBODIA'S INTERNATIONAL TRADE VOLUME SURGES TO OVER USD 36 BILLION IN FIRST 7 MONTHS OF 2025

among others. Additionally, there is a significant focus on the processing of fruits and the manufacturing of toys and decorative items for various festivals.

In a notable move towards enhancing infrastructure, two major projects have also been greenlighted. These involve the development of a 200 MW/400 MW energy storage system station in Pursat province, as well as a 300 MW/600 MW energy storage system station in Kampong Chhnang province.

These promising investment projects are strategically located in several provinces, including Takeo, Kampong Speu, Kampong Chhnang, Pursat, and Battambang, contributing to the broader economic development and job creation in the region.

With the Cambodian government's continued efforts to attract investment, the growth potential for these sectors looks bright, ushering in a new era of industrial and economic advancement for the country.

Cambodia is set to boost its economic landscape with the registration of 17 new investment projects, totaling approximately USD 367 million in investment capital. This initiative, revealed during the 12th "Single Entry-Exit Meeting" held on 15 August 2025, is anticipated to create around 7,200 job opportunities across the nation.

H.E. Chea Vuthy, Secretary-General of the Investment Committee of Cambodia, highlighted the projects' diverse focus across 15 industrial sectors. The key areas of investment include manufacturing energy storage devices, electrical appliances, sports equipment, and decorative materials,



The Ongoing Decline: Understanding China's Falling Housing Prices a Year After Stimulus

Exploring the factors behind the persistent downturn in China's real estate market despite government efforts to revive it.

Despite the Chinese government's aggressive stimulus measures a year ago aimed at reviving the housing market, prices continue to decline in many cities across the country. This ongoing downward trend can be attributed to several interconnected factors that have shaped the current economic landscape.

One of the main reasons for the persistent drop in housing prices is the waning confidence among homebuyers. Following years of rapid price increases, many potential buyers are now skeptical about the long-term value of investing in real estate. Reports indicate that numerous individuals

are holding off on purchases, anticipating further price drops as supply outstrips demand.

The aftermath of the government's stimulus, which was originally intended to stabilize the market, has also had mixed results. While the initiative did succeed in boosting construction activity temporarily, it failed to address the underlying issues plaguing the real estate sector, such as high debt levels among developers and a significant oversupply of residential properties. Many construction firms are still grappling with financial instability, which has led to unfinished projects and a lack of new housing developments entering the market.



Furthermore, stricter regulatory measures introduced to curb excessive borrowing and speculation have contributed to the cooling of the housing market. The Chinese government has tightened policies around property purchases and lending, making it more difficult for households to obtain mortgages. This has directly affected buyer sentiment and purchasing power, further dampening sales.

Economic uncertainties, including sluggish economic growth and fears of a global recession, have intensified concerns about job security and income stability among consumers. This hesitance to spend on such a significant investment as housing has resulted in a notable decline in transactions, contributing to the falling prices.

Lastly, shifting demographics and preferences among younger generations are also impacting the market dynamics. Many young professionals are showing a preference for renting over buying, influenced by lifestyle changes and a desire for flexibility. This shift in housing preferences creates additional pressure on the market, causing a gradual decline in ownership rates.

In conclusion, while the Chinese government's big bang stimulus aimed to reinvigorate the housing sector, a combination of declining buyer confidence, regulatory constraints, and broader economic challenges has continued to exert downward pressure on housing prices. Unless there are significant policy adjustments or market changes, the outlook for the housing market remains uncertain.



Cambodia and China Team Up to Boost Smart Tourism

Cambodian Customs Revenue and Trade Volume Surge

In a promising start to the year, Cambodia's international trade volume soared to approximately USD 9.44 billion during the first two months of 2025, marking a remarkable 16.3% increase compared to the same period in 2024, according to a recent report from the General Department of Customs and Excise of Cambodia.

Export activities also showed positive growth, with goods valued at USD 4.46 billion shipped overseas, reflecting an 11.9% rise. Meanwhile, imports climbed even higher, reaching USD 4.987 billion—a significant increase of 20.6%.

The United States remains a key market for Cambodian exports, with a trade volume of USD 1.626 billion recorded. Vietnam also represents a crucial trade partner, contributing significantly

to export figures. Notably, China has solidified its position as Cambodia's largest importer, with an impressive USD 2.444 billion worth of goods traded, a 24% increase compared to the same timeframe last year.

Cambodia's diverse export portfolio consists of clothing, machinery, electrical equipment, footwear, grains, furniture, rubber, fruits, vegetables, pearls, toys, and textiles, showcasing the country's robust manufacturing and agricultural sectors.

As these numbers reveal, Cambodia's trade landscape is evolving, highlighting the country's growing economic engagement on the global stage.

Shifting Sands: New Regulations Impact Chinese Home Buyers in Seoul

In recent years, Seoul has witnessed a remarkable uptick in foreign home ownership, predominantly driven by Chinese buyers drawn to the South Korean capital's real estate market. Their presence has not only transformed the property landscape but has also sparked significant economic discussions amid soaring housing prices. However, a recent regulatory shift signals potential changes in this trend.

Historically, Chinese investors have flocked to Seoul, attracted by factors such as proximity to China, a robust economy, and cultural ties. Reports indicate that in 2022, approximately 43% of all foreign real estate transactions in Seoul were made by Chinese nationals, with over 6,000 purchases recorded that year alone. Many were purchasing apartments in prime districts like Gangnam and Seocho, where the average price of an apartment has reached around 30 million KRW (approximately \$25,000) per square meter.

However, in an effort to stabilize the housing market and curb speculative buying, the South Korean government has enacted new regulations that specifically target foreign ownership in the residential property sector. The changes include increased property acquisition taxes, which can now reach as high as 12% for foreign buyers, and tightened scrutiny on foreign investments, requiring proof of genuine residency or economic ties to South Korea.

Real estate experts and analysts suggest that these new rules may initially deter Chinese investors. In light of the new regulations, anticipated foreign investment in Seoul's real estate market is projected to drop by 20% in 2024. Some analysts predict that as the new regulations take effect, the demographics of home buyers may shift, with local Koreans and other foreign nationals now more likely to enter the market.

Despite the possible slowdown, many remain optimistic about the overall market dynamics. Some believe that the heightened scrutiny could foster a more sustainable housing market, preventing further inflation driven by foreign investments. Local real estate agents report an increase in inquiries from domestic buyers, suggesting they are beginning to seize the opportunity to invest in areas previously dominated by foreign purchases.

As the sun sets over the iconic skyline of Seoul, the future of its real estate market remains uncertain. The new regulations may reshape the landscape of foreign investment, but the capital's charm and economic resilience suggest that change often brings new opportunities. With the potential for local buyers to reclaim some ground, the next chapters in Seoul's property story are set to be written amid these evolving conditions, reflecting the changing tides of global investment.



Ministry of Land Management Completes Extensive Land Survey in Phnom Penh

In a significant milestone for urban planning and land management, the Ministry of Land Management has successfully completed the survey of 465,919 plots of land in Phnom Penh. This achievement marks a crucial step towards systematic land registration in the capital, with an estimated total of 477,299 plots identified.

During a ceremony held on July 16, 2025, at the Prek Leap National Institute of Agriculture, real estate identification certificates were distributed to 51 families in the Prek Khvet community. The event was graced by His Excellency Say Samal, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Ministry of Land Management, Urban Planning and Construction.

In his address, His Excellency Say Samal expressed gratitude to the residents involved in the land registration campaign, as well as to collaborating bodies, including the Ministry of Agriculture and the Ministry of Economy. The initiative not only facilitated the issuance of real estate identification certificates but also highlighted the persistent challenges surrounding land registration and its unclear relations between state institutions and citizens.

He noted that while considerable progress has been made, there remains a necessity to address undisputed lands, presenting this campaign as a model for resolving similar issues across different organizations.

As of now, the statistics reveal that in Phnom Penh, out of the total estimated land plots, 465,919 have been successfully measured, with 462,434 marked and 304,993 land titles issued from a total of 337,184 titles prepared.

Notably, the effort has been extensive, with 13 of the 14 districts in Phnom Penh having received land measurements and titles. The only exception is the 7 Makara District, which has not yet undergone systematic registration, focusing instead on individual plot and house ownership registrations.

This ambitious project demonstrates the Ministry's commitment to enhancing transparency in land ownership and improving urban management, ultimately benefiting the residents of Phnom Penh.
